GPA Consulting	The RFQ states that biological monitoring is required during initial ground disturbing activities and as needed during construction activities. The NEPA CE and NES mention that a full time monitor is recommended to ensure that construction impacts on jurisdictional resources are minimized. Should we assume that full time construction monitoring is needed? If so, how many construction days are anticipated for the project?	The project construction duration is estimated for 45 working days—this includes both locations (MP 1.75 and 12.69). While full time biological monitoring is required for initial ground disturbing activities, and spot checks thereafter, we don't anticipate biological monitoring for construction activities such as mobilization, traffic control setup, equipment staging, paving operations and striping.
